ELAINE GREENFIELD, PIANIST

Elaine Greenfield has performed throughout North America as soloist and ensemble player. N.Y. Times critic Peter Davis praised her Carnegie Recital Hall debut: "...the playing was well conceived, etched in a clearly drawn, rhythmically strong profile. Ms. Greenfield possesses a formidable technique which she uses for intimate, expressive purposes rather than flashy surface effect." In 2000 she recorded Debussy Preludes, Bks. 1 & 2 on an historic 1907 Bluthner of Leipzig, Debussy's piano of choice. Other recordings include "Piano 4 Hands," Debussy "Preludes, Bk. 1" (1984), "VCME," a CD with the Vermont Contemporary Music Ensemble of which she is a founding member, and "Music of Her Own," songs and piano music by women, the result of a Vermont Arts Council Fellowship Award. Ms. Greenfield has been listed on the Council's Touring Artists Register since 1972 and in 1986 received the Centennial Award of Merit for "Outstanding Contributions to Musical America" from SUNY Potsdam. She holds degrees from the Crane School of Music and the Peabody Conservatory. Additional study was in New York with Adamant Music School founder, Edwine Behre. Ms. Greenfield has been an artist faculty member of the Adamant Music School since 1973.

JAN MEYER THOMPSON, PIANIST

Jan Meyer Thompson, Professor of Piano at Arizona State University, has performed solo recitals and chamber music across the United States, Ĉanada, Mexico, Europe, and Russia. As pianist with The Kent Camerata, a five-member international vocal and instrumental ensemble, Ms. Thompson recently toured the Republic of Ireland and Northern Ireland, to reviews which acclaimed her "beautiful sound, easy versatility of style, and remarkable sensitivity to phrasing and nuance." Ms. Thompson is recorded on compact disc in ensemble performances with singers Mary Sue Hyatt and Jane Dressler (Song Upon Song, TimGrabber Digital), with bassoonist David DeBolt (A Musical Painting Comes to Life, Crystal Records, 2001), and with piano duo partner Elaine Greenfield (Piano 4-Hands). She holds the Doctor of Music degree in Performance-Chamber Music from Northwestern University, where her principal teachers were Gui Mombaerts and Donald Isaak. Ms. Thompson has been on the faculty of Arizona State University since 1977 and a member of the Adamant Music School (Adamant, Vermont) summer artist faculty since 1990.
