Dr. Diane Cawein Barger is Professor of Clarinet at the University of Nebraska School of Music and a member of the Moran Woodwind Quintet. Prior to that appointment in 1994, Dr. Barger held positions in the Florida Orchestra, the Naples Philharmonic, the Tampa Bay Opera Orchestra, the Tallahassee Symphony and the Chicago Civic Orchestra. She currently serves as principal clarinet with the Lincoln Symphony Orchestra and is Treasurer of the International Clarinet Association.

An active soloist and chamber musician, master class clinician and adjudicator throughout the United States, Dr. Barger was a featured artist at the 2007 (Canada), 2006 (Georgia), 2005 (Tokyo), 2004 (Washington, D.C.), 2000 (Oklahoma) and 1997 (Texas) International Clarinet Association's ClarinetFests and the 2002 and 1998 Oklahoma Clarinet Symposium in Norman, Oklahoma.

With the Moran Woodwind Quintet, one of the most active and visible quintets in the Midwest, Dr. Barger participated in two lecture/performances at the 2005 College Music Society International Conference in Alcala de Henaras, Spain and the 2005 CMS National Conference in Quebec City, Canada. With the oboist and bassoonist of the quintet, Dr. Barger was a featured guest artist in a recital at the 2004 International Double Reed Society convention in Melbourne, Australia.

Dr. Barger received the Doctor of Music (1999) and Bachelor of Music (1988) degrees from the Florida State University where she was a student of Frank Kowalsky. While completing the Graduate Certificate in Performance (1990) and Master of Music (1989) degrees from Northwestern University she was a student of Robert Marcellus. Dr. Barger is a Buffet Crampon, USA Artist/Clinician.

Dr. Albie Micklich joined Arizona State University in the fall of 2006. Prior to this appointment Dr. Micklich was on the faculty of Indiana University of Pennsylvania, University of Missouri-Columbia, Michigan State University and University of Nebraska-Lincoln. Dr. Micklich holds degrees from Indiana University of Pennsylvania, Michigan State University and The Juilliard School. An active member in the International Double Reed Society, Dr. Micklich presented recitals at Ball State University, Monash University in Melbourne, Australia, University of North Carolina-Greensboro and University of West Virginia. An active chamber musician, Dr. Micklich performed at the International Clarinet Association conference in Tokyo, Japan and the College Music Society conferences in San Antonio, TX, Madrid, Spain and Quebec City, Canada. He can be heard on the CD recordings Wind Chamber Music of Theodor Blumer, Vol. 2 and Vol. 3, David Maslanka's Woodwind Quintet #3 and Music for Dr. Who for bassoon and piano and Roger Daltry - A Celebration: The Music of Pete Townshend. He has contributed on three PBS specials; Willa Cather: The Road is All, The Monkey Trials (winner of a 2003 George Foster Peabody Award) and Distant Melodies, Postcards for Europe. In his free time Dr. Micklich is a competitive runner and marathoner.

him to four continents. He has performed in recital with such artists as violinist Chec-Yun, flutist Thomas Robertello, composer Bright Sheng, and tenor Anthony Dean Griffey, with whom he has also collaborated on several operatic productions. He has served as opera rehearsal pianist for such distinguished conductors as Andre Previn and Plácido Domingo, and has worked closely with the composer Carlisle Floyd on several productions of his operas. Chamber music performances have taken him to distinguished venues including Weill Recital Hall at Carnegie Hall, where The Strad and Strings magazines both hailed his performance as "excellent." His partnership with violinist Katie McLin in the McLin/Campbell Duo and McLin and clarinetist Robert Spring in Trio del Sol has led to performances on numerous recital series throughout the United States. As an orchestral pianist, he has performed with many ensembles including the Phoenix Symphony, the Columbus Pro Musica Chamber Orchestra, and the Brevard Music Center Festival Orchestra. He has appeared as collaborative pianist at numerous international conferences. including the International Double Reed Society, National Flute Association Convention, MTNA and the Society for American Music. Dr. Campbell is currently Assistant Professor of Collaborative Piano and Chamber Music at the Arizona State University School of Music.
