JOHN METZ, FORTEPIANO

BARBARA BAILEY, CLASSICAL CELLO

Organ Hall Sunday, March 8, 1998 7:30 p.m. John Metz's fortepiano was made in 1975 by Robert Smith, and extensively re-built by Loomis Restoration Fabrik, for Dr. Metz, in 1997. It is a copy of the 1795 Johann Jakob Könicke in the Yale Collection. Typical of Viennese instruments, the hammers are covered in leather, and hinged on the far end of key so that the hammer is nearer the player -- an opposite arrangement from the modern piano. It has two knee levers -- one for the dampers, the other is a moderator, or "soft" pedal.

Barbara Bailey's cello is set up in the manner of Beethoven's day, with gut strings and no end-pin. This set-up, combined with 18th century fingering and bowing techniques, produces a sound more in keeping with the classical ideal -- greater transparency with more resonance. The bow was made by Ralph Ashmead in 1997 for Barbara Bailey, and is a copy of a bow believed to be by John Dodd (1755-1839.)

Rayner Taylor -- composer, singer, organist -- was possibly the most important musician in Federalist period America. Nevertheless, his Six Sonatas for Cello, the manuscript of which is in the Library of Congress, have never been published, nor are they available in recording. Dr. Metz and Ms Bailey plan to publish and record the six sonatas, and wish to thank the College of Fine Arts of Arizona State University for a research grant which has aided them in their investigations into the manuscript and classical performance practice.
