Nancy Green -- A native of Boston, Green studied at the Juilliard School with Leonard Rose and Lynn Harrell, participated in the master classes of Mstislav Rostropovich and after graduation was awarded a Rockefeller Grant to study with Jacqueline de Pre in London. She made her home in Holland, Germany, and most recently London where she was professor of cello at the Guildhall School of Music and Drama from 1989 to 1994. She has recently returned to the U.S. her position as professor of cello on the faculty at the University of Arizona. An active recording artist, Green was recently the first cellist to record the complete Hungarian Dances by Johannes Brahms.

Kelland Thomas -- He is an assisant professor of saxophone at the University of Arizona. He has performed as a soloist and with orchestras throughout the U.S. and in Canada, Switzerland, Germany and Italy, since his debut with the Houston Symphony in 1993. As a member of the Michigan Chamber Players, Thomas completed a seven-concert tour of Japan with world-renowned marimbist Keiko Abe in 1997. An active performer of new music, he has premiered numerous works written for him. As a chamber musician, he has been a regular member of the award-winning Borealis Saxophone quaret and the Donald Sinta Quartet, as well as appearances with the nationally acclaimed PRISM Saxophone Quartet and MIDI Ensemble.
